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About the Initiative

The Future Care Project was created to give regional families a voice and to drive change where it is needed most. Our vision is to be a nationwide resource that champions childcare access, providing solutions that are built for regional realities. We are tackling one of the most urgent challenges of our time: the lack of early childhood education and care, which holds back families and the futures of our local communities.

In many regional areas, the lack of childcare services has become a critical barrier. Parents, particularly skilled women, are unable to return to work, and businesses struggle to retain staff. To respond, the Future Care Project seeks to support flexible and sustainable models of care, designed to support regional families and strengthen the stability of local workforce.





The Project has been built in collaboration between families, educators, and employers, with the conviction that solutions must be shaped and led by the community itself. Its mission is to deliver practical tools that meet real regional needs, while fostering collective wellbeing and long-term economic growth.

In regional Australia, the lack of accessible childcare is not only a family concern but also a pressing economic issue. Within the Goondiwndi Region, waitlists often stretch beyond two years with parents unable to return to the workforce. This directly impacts business productivity and limits economic growth.

Survey data confirms the scale of the crisis: in 2024, the Goondiwindi Chamber of Commerce and Thrive by Five reported that 78% of regional businesses experienced serious operational challenges due to childcare shortages.

The consequences are clear: lost jobs, lost income, and lost opportunities for families who feel they can't stay, can't thrive, and can't choose to grow their families, all because access to care is out of reach.

The Future Care Project positions itself as both a community-led solution and a national economic driver. By promoting flexible, sustainable, CCS-eligible childcare models, it enables families to thrive, strengthens local businesses, and builds the resilience of regional economies.



The Voice Behind The Future Care Project



What began as personal advocacy has grown into a mission: to ensure that where you live doesn't determine the quality of care your children receive or the opportunities you have as a parent or business owner. Over the past 2 years, I've worked alongside families, educators, local providers, government and industry leaders to seek out long-term, community-driven solutions that support both families and businesses to access early childcare education and care.

I believe that when we provide parents with both a choice in the care their children receive and the choice of when they can rejoin the workforce, we can build stronger families and stronger regional economies.

Supports Greater Access to Care

The Future Care Project is dedicated to delivering childcare solutions for regional families that are affordable, flexible, and community-driven. No parent should ever be forced to choose between building their career and ensuring their children receive the quality care they deserve.

By attracting educators and supporting the growth of family day care, in-home care, and invenue care, alongside strengthening community-run NFP childcare providers, the project seeks to build local capacity while meeting the diverse needs of both parents and children.



Connecting Families and Educators

We are building a platform that directly links families with educators based on their needs, location, and preferences.

Skilling a New Workforce

The first digital platform designed to help new educators thrive by bringing together business support, practical tools, and educational resources in one place.

Data-Driven Solutions

We're building a central database to monitor childcare demand, waitlists, and workforce capacity, with built-in checks to support educator wellbeing, compliance, and childcare safety.

Inspired Funding Solutions

We seek to offer bursaries and interestfree loans to help new educators cover training and setup costs for establishing home-based childcare services. The Future Care Project is built on the belief that by providing wrap-around business support for smaller organisations and lesser-known care models, we can create more childcare places where they're needed most.

That's why we focus on solutions:

- Training and mentoring new educators to build local workforce capacity.
- Expanding access to family day care, in-home care, and in-venue care by providing funding that removes the barrier of start-up costs for establishing new services.
- Empowering communitybased, not-for-profit childcare providers to creating a level playing field with for-profit services

The Stats 250+ & 2 year waitlist

With more than 250 families on our local waitlists Goondiwindi is considered a childcare desert, defined as having more than three children for every one available place.





